We will be asking a member of each family to fill out a card. If you have **already** given to this year's appeal please indicate how much you gave or pledged. By filling out the card we will be able to check and make sure that your gift was correctly credited towards our parish goal. If you haven't yet given to this year's appeal and are able to support our diocesan ministries, please fill out the card and check the **Yes** box and list the dollar amount of your pledge. The Diocese will then send you a statement verifying your pledge and will inform you how to make payments on your pledge. If you choose you could make a check payable to The Diocese of Rochester for the amount of your gift and hand it in to the ushers with your filled out **CMA** Card. The ushers at Mass will be collecting the filled out **CMA** cards after the regular Sunday Offertory Collection. Thank you all for your generous support. We are very close to reaching our parish goal. As of January 11, 128 parishioners of Good Shepherd Catholic Community have pledged or given \$28,390 towards our goal of \$29,732. I extend a special thanks to all those who have given or made pledges to our annual appeal. Your gift helps make possible the many ministries of outreach and parish support that are funded by the **CMA**.

Fruit Basket Project Report

People have asked me how we did with the Fruit Basket Project. I was once again amazed at how well we did! This year we made over 250 baskets and increase of 40 from last year. Of the 250 baskets, over 100 baskets were donated to the homebound, needy, and our "senior parishioners". The project raised \$1,688.71 after expenses. The proceeds will be used for Youth activities and retreats. I thank those who helped with the project and all who supported it.

The Epiphany Celebration at the Lasca's Restaurant was a great time for all who attended and the food was delicious! I thank the members of the Parish Activities committee that formed after our Visioning Days for arranging the details for the dinner and helped take the reservations. It was a wonderful way to close out the *Advent-Christmas-Epiphany* season.

Last Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord reminded us of the gift of the Holy Spirit that we received from Jesus and the Father when we were baptized.
