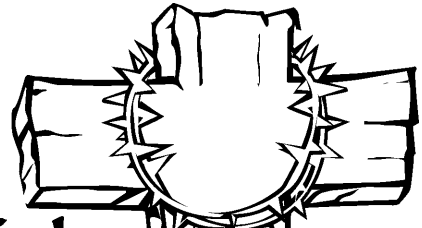
NEW PARISHIONERS - Welcome! Please introduce yourselves to the Parish Staff. We want to get to know you.

As we journey through the second half of Lent I am beginning to think that the winter weather is behind us and the days of spring and the new life of Easter are getting closer. This year our journey through this fifth week of Lent takes place in the third week of March. A week that for me has many significant days. On March 15th I always think of Latin class in Junior High when the final words of Julius Caesar were recalled, "Et tu Brute?" Whereas the Ides of March marked the end for Caesar's life, March 15th marked the beginning of life for Rev. Patrick Van Durme, who was assigned with me during his first years of priesthood. While the 15th was his actual birthday his family always celebrated his birthday on March 17th, the Feast Day of St. Patrick. He once told me he had reached school age before he realized that his birthday was really on the Ides of March!

March 18th was my father's birthday. I always remembered it because it fell between two great feasts, St. Patrick's Day and St. Joseph's Day on March 19th. With the warm weather we have had this week, I think back to one of my Father's birthdays after we moved to New Hartford, it was 78 degrees that year on March 18th! My Mom decided to surprise him and gave an impromptu invitation to her sister and her family of six children to drive up to our house from Oneonta for a birthday dinner. My dad came home from work and was puzzled as to what we were waiting for since the meal was ready to eat. The only problem was the invited guests had not arrived! My mother didn't want to ruin the surprise but had run out of stalling techniques. My cousins finally arrived; it turned out they had to keep stopping on the way as the stomach of one of the boys didn't like the ups and downs of all the hills and valleys on the road to New Hartford. We finally sat down to dinner but if I remember correctly the meal was quite overdone. My dad though did appreciate the birthday surprise!

March 20th, was my Dad's father's birthday; the first day of spring. He would have been 125 years old this year. I received my middle name, Arthur, in honor of him. I always thought it was great that St. Joseph's Day was sandwiched in between my dad and my grandpa's birthdays. Three father figures for me. My grandpa Moorby died before my seventh birthday but I have fond memories of visiting him and my grandma for Sunday dinners in Cooperstown. Grampa use to bake a lot of pies and turnovers and tarts, all things that made a small boy happy. While he has been gone for nearly as many years as he lived, I still think of him every time I look at the water color paintings he painted, paintings that I now have hanging on my walls. Most of his paintings were of scenes of waterfronts, or the rural countryside. As I travel over the terrain of Good Shepherd Catholic Community, I often see views that remind me of one of Grandpa's paintings. I still have a dream of trying my hand at painting someday.

I share these memories with you to illustrate how memory itself is a great gift from God. These memories don't just recall the past events of my life, they are events that took place in time that are still active and life giving, still at work in me, shaping me into the person God wants me to be. Next Sunday, we enter into Holy Week, and recall the events of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection. Events that we still participate in as His followers, events that continue to give us life through His Spirit, shaping and molding us into the living Body of Christ. May we recall His gift to us and live on each day in His love.
