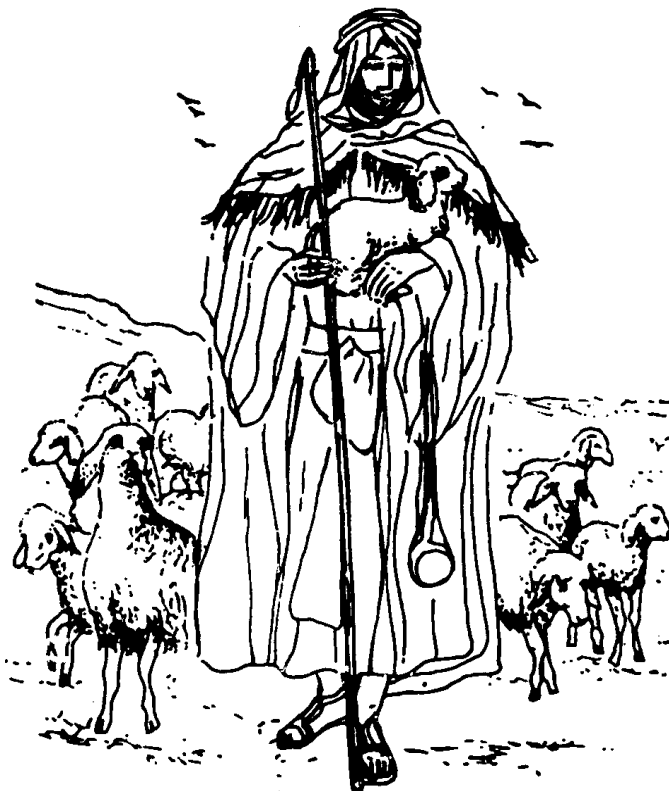

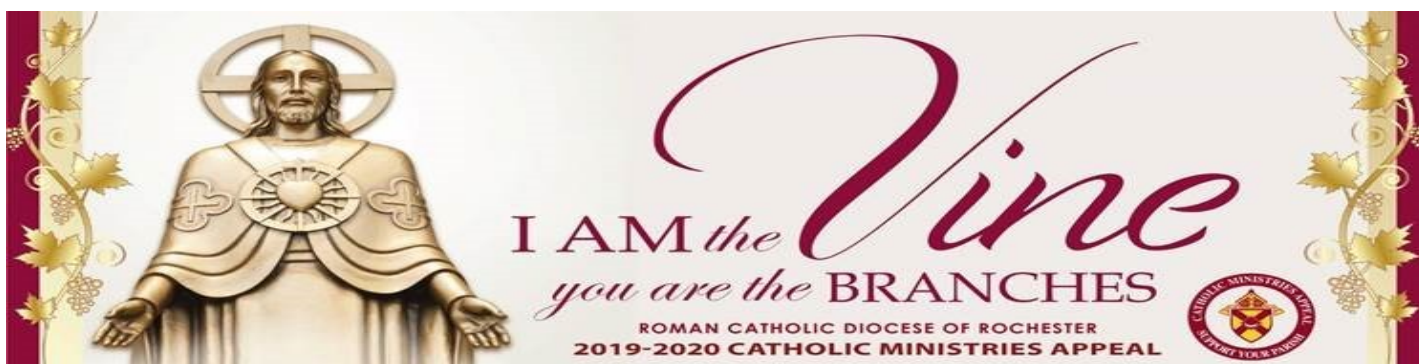

Before I entered the seminary I worked as a Produce Manager in a supermarket. I had worked in many grocery stores during my high school and college days. I always started out in the grocery department and I always seemed to end up working in the produce departments. When I was in high school my first job in produce was being assigned to make fruit baskets for Christmas. When I was ordained I began making fruit baskets at Christmas time with the youth of the parishes where I have served. This year will be my sixth year working with the youth of Good Shepherd Catholic Community making fruit baskets for Christmas. Every year we had made more baskets and have had more baskets donated! Last year we made over 300 baskets of which 155 baskets were donated! This year we will be making them again. Tags will be available in our churches for donated gifts.

Below is a list of some of the ways your CMA donation is used in our diocese.

HOW AND WHEN YOUR CMA GIFT IS USED

Your gift to the Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) is crucial. Donations fund the day-to-day operations of the Diocese of Rochester. Without your generosity, we could not continue to support our parishes and fulfill our mission.

When your donation is received, we utilize it immediately for current operations. The CMA supports offices, personnel and ministries that provide assistance and resources to parishes, pastors, parish ministers and Pastoral and Finance Councils through such offices as Safe Environment, Information Technology, Evangelization & Catechesis, Pastoral Services, Finance, Building/Property Management, Stewardship and Communications, the Tribunal and Risk Management. In fact, the CMA funds nearly 60 percent of the current diocesan operating budget in seven key areas:

- Serving the poor, the elderly and infirm through Catholic Charities
- Providing diocesan-wide services to our parishes and institutions
- Educating the young and young adults in the Catholic faith in our schools, parish religious education programs and on college campuses.
- Funding the formation of seminarians, deacons, pastoral leaders and vocations
- Supporting the ministries of Bishop Matano, the New York State Catholic Conference, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Vatican.
- Funding operations & support services of the Pastoral Center, including maintenance and capital improvements
- Supporting the fundraising efforts of the CMA campaign, such as the cost of mailings, gift and data processing and staffing.

All funds raised in the CMA are used for programs, services and ministries. No CMA contributions are used for the settlement of legal cases.
