Two weeks ago at our Future Visioning session in Scipio Center, those in attendance were asked to make a statement about our parish based on the values that our parish saw as most important when we surveyed you at Mass. Going forward the Pastoral Council will use these statement to help formulate a Vision Statement for our parish.

Parish-wide Social Events Action: Parish Picnic (4 Team Members)

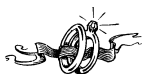
Parish-wide volunteer ministries Action: Musicians Ministry Action: Bereavement Ministry (4 team members)
