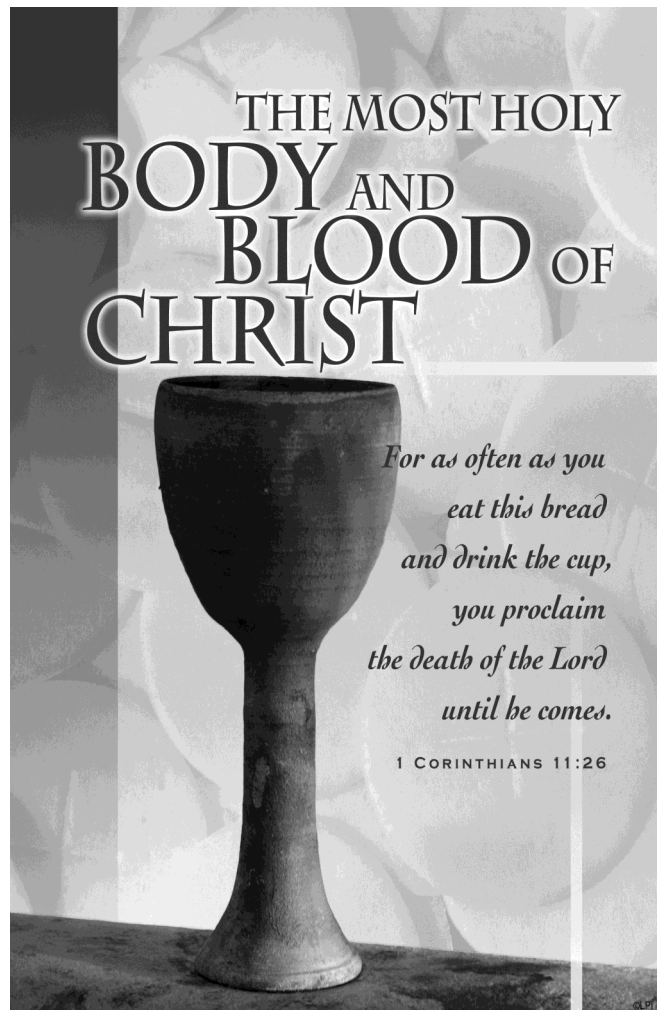

Vacation Bible School 2015 "Shining Star- Where Kids Shine God's Light"

Once again this summer we are off on a wonderful adventure at Vacation Bible School, August 3, 4 5, & 6 on the lake at St Patrick's, Aurora. (We have added an additional day!!) To preregister, please fill out the VBS forms that are available at each of the churches and return them to us by placing them in the collection basket or sending them in the mail. Vacation Bible School begins each day at 9:30am with praise songs on the lawn. Then each group of VBS students travel with their Group Leader to the various stations which include Bible, Craft and Game Centers. We gather together again at 11:30am for a snack and fellowship and close our day with praise songs. This year the theme is "Shining Star- Where kids Shine God's Light.". Students will learn about Hannah's prayer in the Old Testament. They will learn how Samuel heard God's call and became a light for world. Day 2 the message will center on staying on God's path and living according to His teachings. The bible verse of the day is from Psalm 119:105- "Your word is a lamp before my feet and a light for my path." Day 3 we will talk about forgiveness and living as children of God. The students will learn more about St Paul- his travels, his conversion and his deep faith. St Paul truly became a light of his faith. And lastly on Day 4 we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. In the New Testament Jesus is with three of His disciples- Peter, James & John on a mountain preparing to pray. There Jesus is transfigured- His face shines like the sun. The symbol of Light appears once again. Our message continues as we are called to shine God's Light in this world. On our last day together we will celebrate with an Ice Cream Social and a special closing Ceremony. Each of our students will be invited to make and decorate a Luminaria. They will bring their craft creation to the church where we will close with song and prayer. Join us as we shine God's abundant Light throughout this week.

DEACON'S CORNER:

"By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled himself to share in our humanity". These words are spoken inaudibly by the Deacon or, in the absence of a Deacon, by the priest as the water is poured into the wine as the gifts are prepared for consecration at the altar. St. Cyprian writing around 250 AD gives the following explanation to this ritual: "For because Christ bore us all, in that He also bore our sins, we see that in the water is understood the people, but in the wine is showed the blood of Christ. But when the water is mingled in the cup with wine, the people [are] made one with Christ, and the assembly of believers is associated and conjoined with Him on whom it believes; which association and conjunction of water and wine is so mingled in the Lord's cup, that that mixture cannot any more be separated."... "Whence, moreover, nothing can separate the Church — that is, the people established in the Church, faithfully and firmly persevering in that which they have believed — from Christ, in such a way as to prevent their undivided love from always abiding and adhering. ("On the Sacrament of the Cup of the Lord," No 13). As we hear in today's readings the Blood of Christ brings us into a new and everlasting covenant in which we are forever comingled by our Baptism and which we bring to fruition in our humble service to the world in the name and with the grace of the Divine Christ.
