*Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time***As we go forward together**

I am writing this bulletin article on June 24th. It was five years ago today that I became pastor of Good Shepherd Catholic Community. I realize when I arrived here that my six year term would end one year short of reaching the diocesan retirement age of seventy, but I figured that I would probably be allowed to serve here for the additional year. Since then the diocesan retirement age for priests has been raised to age 75. When the change was made they gradually increased the retirement age for the priests that were approaching seventy, so for me the earliest I can retire is at age 74. So I am now hoping to be assigned to a second term here as your pastor and serve here until I retire. With that said, as we look to the future together, it is important to plan and envision how our parish's ministry should develop. At the June Pastoral Council meeting I said a blessing over the newly selected Council that will be working together this year. It is also vitally important that we as a parish are rooted in prayer and ask for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit.

As we continue our journey together I ask you to pray for the Pastoral Council members and to pray for yourself for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit in your life and the life of our parish.
