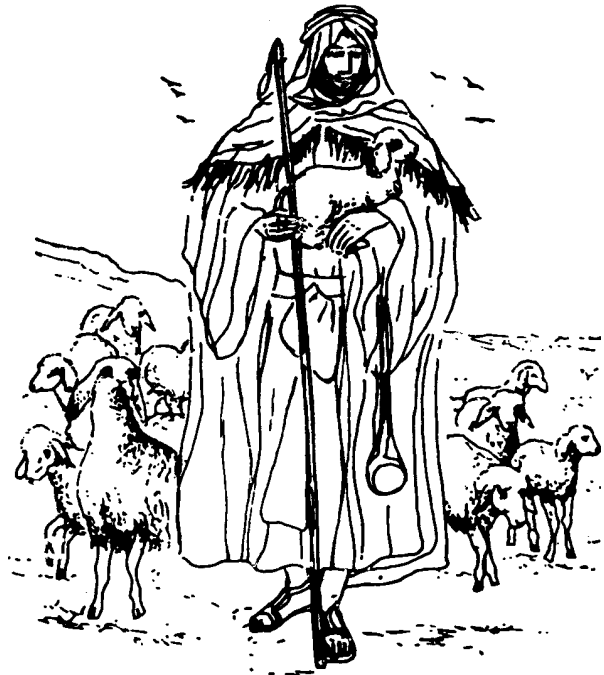

## **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**

The annual **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** begins Wednesday, January 18. The 2017 theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is "Reconciliation – The Love of Christ Compels Us (2 Corinthians 5:14-20).". The churches of Union Springs have been observing this Week of Prayer for the past 38 years. During the week of prayer gatherings will be held St. Michael Church and at Trinity United Church in Union Springs. There will be no sessions this year at the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Union Springs since they are recovering from a recent fire on their campus. Please keep their assembly in your prayers. On Sunday, January 22, we are having a Dish to Pass Supper at Trinity United Church of Christ, 163 Cayuga Street, Union Springs. Supper begins at 6:00 p.m. followed by a prayer service based on this year's theme "Reconciliation – The Love of Christ Compels Us". I will be the homilist this year. **Everyone is welcome!** We hope that you will pray for Christian Unity this week and we hope to see you at the dish to pass.

The observance of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began in an Episcopal Church in 1908 at Graymoor, in the Hudson Valley. This observance was started by Father Paul James Wattson, an Episcopal priest, who was the co-founder, with Sister Lurana Mary White, of the Franciscan religious congregations comprising the Society of the Atonement at Graymoor. Fr. Wattson was a vigorous advocate of Anglican and Roman Catholic reunion. He felt strongly led to pray for church unity and began what was then called "Church Unity Week" beginning on the Feast of the Chair of Peter (at that time January 18), and ending on the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25). This observance has been known by various names throughout its history. But, during that time its purpose has remained the same; to pray for unity among all Christians who comprise the body of Christ.

## **Catholic Ministries Appeal**

Next weekend, January 21/22, we will be having an in-pew solicitation for the **Catholic Ministries Appeal**. If you haven't yet given to this year's appeal this will give you another opportunity to make a pledge to the **CMA**. If you choose you could make a check payable to The Diocese of Rochester for the amount of your gift and hand it in to the ushers with your filled out **CMA** Card. The ushers at Mass will be collecting the filled out **CMA** cards after the regular Sunday Offertory Collection. Thank you all for your generous support. We are very close to reaching our parish goal. We hope to go over the goal as we did last year on with the in-pew solicitation weekend. As of January 9, 123 parishioners of Good Shepherd Catholic Community have pledged or given \$29,728.50 or 88.2% of our parish goal of \$33,711. I extend a special thanks to all those who have given or made pledges to our annual appeal. Your gift helps make possible the many ministries of outreach and parish support that are funded by the **CMA**.
